THE CROPS IN THE UNITED STATES. THE COMING WHEAT CROP.-We notice a good many discrepant statements going the rounds of the press, relative to the appearance of the wheat crop in this Territory and in Illinois. So far as Wisconsin is concerned we are persuaded that the yield of wheat will be abundant unless someappear from the Aurora Beacon (Kane Co ) this is an exaggeration. Within the last few weeks wheat in that region has come forward astonishingly, and many farmers who supposed that their crops had been almost wholly destroyed, now anticipate an average yield. Indeed the Beacon-thinks that a good deal more wheat has been edi-

torially killed than " winter killed." From Michigan on the East, and Iowa on the West of us, we have good accounts of the wheat crop. The surplus exported from this Territory during the last season in wheat and flour, was as near as we can get at the figures, 550,000 bu hels. There can be little doubt that the exports of wheat and flour form Wisconsin, for the present year, will searly a million of bushels. This does not include the amount sent down the Mississippi from the western partisus of the Territory. Milwaukie Sentinel.

Few people are aware of the increased quantity of corn planted this year. The prospects that Inforty Another, in the same neighborhood, has put Joseph Rose, River Trent. in 70 acres, or about five times his usual quantity. fore, but little land, comparatively speaking, has been devoted to its cultivation in Western New York-the demand not being sufficient to induce agriculturists to plant largely. Besides, there are a great many farmers who will not plant corn for distilling. Consequently, they have either neglected it altogether, or have only raised sufficient to supply their own wants. At any price between 60 and 70 cents per bushel, corn is a more profitable crop than wheat at one dollar.
