

TWENTY-ONE YEARS. THE POWER IS PROVIDED

BY THE CANAL (WHICH IS 1100 FEET LONG,

24 FEET WIDE, AND TO CONTAIN 4 FEET WATER).

IT IS ESTIMATED AS EQUIVALENT THIRTY

FEET OF STONE, OR 1500 INCHES OF WATER,

WHICH WILL BE DIVIDED INTO 1ST AND 2ND

CLASS PRIVILEGES. THE HEIGHT OF FALL

FROM THE SURFACE OF THE CANAL TO THE RIVER IS

34 FEET, AND THE LENGTH OF THE RIVER BETWEEN THE CANAL AND THE RIVER WILL

BE ABOUT 150 FEET. THE NAVIGATION IS

NOT NAVIGABLE FROM THE BAY OF

QUINTE, FOR VESSELS DRAWING SIX FEET

WATER, UP TO THE LOWER END OF THE CANAL,

AND THE DISTANCE OF THE VILLAGE FROM

TOWN (24 MILES) IS TRAVELED OVER THE

CANALIZED ROAD IN UPPER CANADA.
