FORWARDING LINE.

VIA OTTAWA AND RIDEAU CANAL.

THE Subscribers beg to notify the

public generally, that they intend

establishing a line of first class Steamers

and Barges, to ply on the Ottawa and

Rideau route, and they will be prepared,

upon the opening of the navigation next

Spring, to forward property consigned to

The necessity for the organization of

of the great transit of the West being

section of the country.
