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EXTRACTS FROM PAPERS PER STEAMSHIP BRITANNIA.

IMPORTANT DEBATE AND VOTE ON THE NAVIGATION LAWS IN THE IMPERIAL PARLIAMENT. In the House of Commons, on the 9th inst., the proposed debate on the navigation laws was introduced by Lord G. Bunsen, who opposed the new mode of free trade principles in a long speech, marked by less than the usual quantity of that fiery violence which animates the orator and statesman of his country.

Mr. House followed the champion of protection in demerit argument, but distinguished by his usual shrewdness and practical spirit. He asked the noble lord, who professed himself so warm a friend to commerce, whether the way to increase commerce was to throw impediments in the way of exchanges? For his part, he was rather surprised that the shipping interest had been able to hold out so long against the effect of the lately abolished monopoly. Now that the heavy taxes on food, timber, and materials of all sorts used in the construction of ships, had been removed, there was no pretence for saying that our shipowners would be unable to maintain a free competition, and meet their rivals in every quarter of the sea.

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
