I mentioned that the new road to the head of Lea Calumets was excavated out of white marble. I should say that the whole surface of this end of the island is one mass of muchle, or chtystallard limestone, chiefly white, but mixed with beautiful green and other varieties. I do not sprak my own spinion that that this marble is lit for ordinary purposes, for of course I cannot know much about the matter; but I am assured that it works easily and will bear the finest of polish. It is certainly very hard and very beautiful to look Mt. I do not see any necessity to send to the United States for the miserable mathle of which chimney pieces and grave stones are manufactured in Canada, when apparently a much more beautiful and equally durable an article is to be procured at our own doors. intend to bring home some specimens of this variegated marble in my carpet beg, and submit them for examination.

Being now as high up the Otlawa as my means or my inclination permit me to ascend, I naturally ask how much higher I could go, without tisk or trouble, were I so inclined. The result of my enquiries is as follows. Above Les Culumets the river is pavigable for eighteen miles, after which the Pouquite Rapids are encountered, three miles in extent; still water is found again after passing Fort Coulogne, a trading post of the Hudson's Bay Company, Iwenty-one miles above Les Calumets, until the fearful Chutes of Des Allumettes, (the Matches,) are met with and passed. Then comes the Deep River, a most sublime and remantic portion of the Ottowa, extending in length thirty-five miles, and abounding in seenery of a most astounding kind. This Deep River on the Lower Canada side is nearly unfathomable but grows shallow towards Upper Canada. No islands obstruct the passage of the trighty waters, but alt is deep, silent, terrible, and dark. At the head of this singular piece of water are the Joachim Rapids, at which there is a Government slide, and beyond which at is a terra incognita, except to the lumbermen, who boast of extending their operations two bundred miles faither up. My worthy host assures me, that with the assistance of three or four locks there would be good and safe steambest navigation from his own door to the Jeachim Rapids, a distance of ninety miles. The settlements above the Calumet are few

and far between. The Calumet Island is not generally fertile, but that of the Allomette Island, larger than the Calumet, is eminently so, and is fast settling. That island and a few patches of land on either side of the river, are the ultima thate of civilization, unless, indeed Fort William, another trading post of the Hudson's Bay Company, just below the Deep River, be so considered. But the El Dorado of the Ottawa, from its source to its innetion with the St. Lawrence, is the amazangly rich and fertile township of Pembroke, in the Bathurst District, about forty miles, (by water,) above the place whereat I am writing. Wherever I go I hear of nothing but Pembroke- If I admire any man's house, I am steld there are over buildings in Rembioke s. if most he compared with the land at I'embroke; nay more, I was somewhat extrayagent in my admiration of Mr. Fitzgibbon's seden at Betown, when my listener stopped me short with the assurance that his own garden at Pembroke was far superior.
