Provincial Parliament.

House of Assembly.

TUESDAY, MAY 22, 1849.

In motion of Mr. D'Avitt, the House resolved into a committee to consider of the Montreal Harbour Dues, and passed a resolution.

The bill to make provision for the erection, repair of Court-Houses and Gaols, at certain towns in Lower Canada, was read the second time, and an amendment made thereto in committee.

The bill to make provision for the cost and completion of proceedings in Bankruptcy now pending in Lower Canada, was referred into a committee, and an amendment made thereto in committee.

Mr. Armstrong introduced a bill for the removal of two steamship companies in Upper Canada, and it was referred into a committee.

Mr. Marion reported the following resolutions, passed in committee yesterday, which he read a second time, and agreed to:

Resolved, That whereas it is expedient to uniformize and cheapen rate of postage;—

And whereas the Imperial Government signified to His Excellency the Governor General its readiness to relinquish the management of that department so soon as a uniform system of postage could have been agreed upon by the different local Governments, and whereas the different Governments of British America have agreed upon following propositions, viz:—

That there be one uniform rate of three cents Provincial Currency, throughout British America;

That no transit postage between the Provinces be allowed;

That two pence sterling the half ounce remain as the rate in operation as respects letters by British Mails, to be extended to provinces having postal conventions with Britain, (unless Her Majesty's Government shall see fit to permit this rate to be reduced to three pence currency);

That the prepayment of postage shall be allowed;

That each Province shall retain the right of postage collected, &c., &c.

That the packet post shall be allowed in the Provinces, one of two rates to be fixed by the Postmaster General, and if prepaid in England, to be sent to the Province where it is to be delivered, &c., &c.

That no particular reading be done, and no particular reading be done, &c., &c.

That postage stamps for pre-mailed mail and colonial stamps be authorized, &c., &c.

That newspaper, pamphlets and magazines be allowed to remain at the post offices, with power to each legislature to do so;

That the rate of remuneration for the Post of the British mails by express in the Provinces of Nova Scotia and Brunswick, be left for future arrangement;

Whereas the Imperial Government have made the said propositions, but nevertheless it is necessary to enable His Excellency to give effect to his plan;

Whereas it is expedient to enable the Governor General to give effect to arrangements as he may deem right for establishment of a uniform rate of postage as soon as the necessary arrangements may be made by the Imperial Legislature;

Whereas it is expedient that such as shall be then in force, be laid both Houses of the Province, within ten days after the opening of the session of the Legislature, and that they shall remain permanently in force as long as it shall be otherwise provided in the Act;

Resolved, That it is expedient to secure a uniform and cheap rate of postage; and that the Governor General in Council be authorized to pay out consolidated revenue fund such sums as may be required to make up any deficiency in the funds arising from the Post Office Department to meet expenses thereof;

Blake then introduced a bill to make for the management of the Post Department, which it will be transferred to the Provincial Government; second motion.

Amendments made in committee, to the Bill to incorporate a Company for construction of a Ship Canal to connect the Lakes, and the River St. Lawrence, were rejected, when Holmes moved, that the question of how he now separately put upon the judgments, which was carried, and the subsequent amendments were then voted, and the Bill ordered to be engrossed.

BAKERSHOP LAW.

Blake moved, that the Bill to make actual provision for the estate and of bankrupts in U.C. be now read a third time, when some discussion took place on the second reading of an old Bankrupt Law for Upper Canada, and by Solicitor General Blaker, in view of the remarks on the subject, the working of the present Law was condemned, and condemned, and proposed for Upper Canada was opposed, of no law being brought in, which part of the Province.
