LORD ELGIN'S RECAL.

The news which we alluded to yesterday, of the real home of the Governor General, has not been confirmed, although as yet, it is generally credited. It would be a happiness of inestimable value were it to prove a fact; for it would quiet the Province for many years to come. In the first place, it would release the Conservatives from their fat's position, and enable them to re-assume their proper attitude, that of being foremost in devotion to British Supremacy and British Connection. Secondly, with the knowledge and assistance before them, they would give up any ideal and futile schemes they may still entertain of regaining their lost political ascendancy, but would devote all their energies to tidding the Province of the terrible incubus of French Domination. The present party in power love the French no more than the Conservatives do; but they are compelled to have recourse to their aid, in order to conquer their old opponents, the Conservatives. The latter should, therefore, coalesce with the Reformers and pitch Monsieur Lafontaine and his Myrmidons to the devil. In fact we see so many advantages from the going home of Lord Elgin, that we trust the news may prove true. We wish his Lordship no ill—on the contrary, we wish him and his family a safe and pleasant voyage to England, where if Lord Grey and Lord John Russell chose to reward his great and important services in Canada with a British Peerage (the great object of his ambition) it will not possibly annoy any person he may leave behind him: so long as he leaves Canada, his friends and relatives may make him a duke for all the Conservatives care.

The Reformers will not be in a worse position by the retirement of Lord Elgin. Whoever is sent out to replace him must adopt his opinions and follow out his policy. There will be a change of men, but not of measures. The only persons who will gain by the change will be the Conservatives. Their dislike to Lord Elgin is personal, and were the Marquis of Clanricarde or any other Whig peer sent out to succeed him, they would have an opportunity of reinstating themselves in their true and proper station;

THE POPE'S VIEW OF THE FRENCH CAPTURE.

Colonel Neil was sent to announce to Pius the ninth, the victory of the French. An Italian journal gives the following account of the reception:

"Colonel Neil, chief of the staff of Gen. Vaillant, was received at Rome by the Pope.

The joy and satisfaction of the Holy Father on hearing the surrender of Rome was profound, and it was with tears in his eyes Plu IX was told of the victory of order and of the deliverance of a population so beloved by him, and long oppressed. He listened with emotion to the history of the sufferings of the French army, to the description of the difficult works executed to save Rome from ruin and disaster. 'Colonel,' added the Supreme Pontiff, under the influence of violent emotion, 'I am already very often, vice versa, France that I have always wished.' She had promised me nothing, and I knew well that when the opportunity would occur, she would give the Church her treasures, her blood, and what is more difficult perhaps for her benevolence, that courage tempered with moderation, that perseverance in suffering to which I owe that my city of Rome has been preserved; Rome, that treasure of the world, that city so beloved and so submitted to such trials, towards during my exile both my heart and my eyes have been constantly turned with anguish.' Tell the General-in-Chief, and all the Generals under his orders, and all the officers, that my thanks should be told to every soldier, that my gratitude is unbounded. My prayers for the prosperity of your country shall be more fervent; as to my affection for the French, it would become stronger, the added with a smile; if it were possible. I should be happy, colonel, to give you personally a proof of my especial esteem.' The colonel answered, that he would be happy if His Holiness would do him and his wife a token of affection. 'Here,' said the Holy Father, immediately giving him a magnificent chapter with exquisite grace, 'here is a present for your poor wife; and here is something for the brave soldier.' The Pope, saying these words, gave him the insignia of the order of St. Gregory."

MORT IN A CONVICT HULK AT BERMUDA.—An inquest was held on Tuesday, July 3, on board the Medway convict ship, by Charles C. Keane, Esq., coroner, on view of the bodies of Thomas Kerigan and John Tolton, who had been shot. The following is the summing up of what was elicited before the jury:—The 400 or 500 hundred convicts on board the Medway were assembled that morning in the open deck, when a general alarm was given, and the punishment of one of their number, James Conran, for mutinous conduct. The overseer F. B. Black Esq., and his officers with the convict guards, fully armed, and their pistols being loaded with ball cartridge (the usual practice, we believe), drew upon the quarter-deck; they numbered twenty in all. The medical officer was also present. The quarter-deck is divided from the upper deck by a railing, about five feet high. The man to be flogged had a brother on board the ship, older than himself, who had permission from the commandant absent himself from witness during the punishment. It was this kind of officer, part of Mr. Black's crew, who appeared with the other prisoners.

When the poorer officers were in the act of securing the man to the grating or ladder, his brother rushed forward, and leaped on the barrier and waving his hat called upon him by name—He (the elder Conran) then addressed some words in Irish to the captain, which was answered by a wild cheer, and a rush of some 250 to the barrier, upon which they clustered like bees, preparatory to a descent upon the quarter-deck. The men were desperately excited. The overseer, with his hand, and called to the men to "get back," which order was quite disregarded. Mr. Black, will be accompanied by three of the royal chas-

plainly perceiving what must be the object of the rebels, viz., the rescue of Conran, and the probable fate of himself and his small party, gave orders to the guards to fire, which was immediately followed by a volley from the front. This did not have any immediate effect, the rebels, men entombed in the idea that the blank cartridge was fired. The rebels, who had been kept in reserve, then moved to the front, and under orders from Mr. Black fired. Two or three of the rebels fell dead, and 12 were wounded. This instantly quelled the mutineers, who hurriedly retreated to living places about the forward part of the ship. The punishment was then administered to the younger Conran. After a lengthy investigation, the jury unanimous, recommended a verdict of "possible mutiny." One of the wounded men died on Tuesday afternoon. An inquest at the hulk was held yesterday. Theingleader Conran was wounded in the pleura. Two others are maimed for life, having had their fingers amputated at the knee, and the other having received a bullet in the spine.
