### CABLE NEWS.

London, Dec. 27 .- The latest reports reduce the number of lives lost by the steamboat disaster on the Tyne to eighteen.

### NEW YORK DESPATCHES.

San Francisco Dec. 26 .- A party of twenty Mexicans and several white men all armed, to-night entered Dignston, Fresus County, and seized twenty citizens, bound their hands and feet, then robbed two stores, getting about two thousand dollars in money and a large quantity of jewels and ribbons. They made their escape, but people are in hot pursuit.

Cleveland, O. Dec. 26. - The locomotive engineers on the Cleveland and Pittsburg Ruilroad struck to-day at noon. Passenger trains were somewhat detained but not abandoned. It is reported that there is a misunderstanding among the engineers and that the strike is without the authority of the brotherhood; also that only twenty-eight or thirty engineers went out and that these have asked to be reinstated.

Washington, Dec. 26.-The Navy Department has full official reports frem Rear Admiral Scott, giving a detailed account of the surrender of the Virginius.
