

THE CULTIVATION OF FRUIT IN CALIFORNIA. (From the San Francisco Bulletin.) The fruit-growers and dealers of California are promoting their common interests by co-operative action in reference to overland shipments. Pending the establishment of definite rates, the companies will carry fruit through for five cents a pound, or \$100 a top. At this rate, it is believed, our best fruits, especially grapes and pears, will pay a fair profit, and preparations are making to forward at least half-a-dozen car loads next week. The Sacramento dealers announce that they will send four car loads Wednesday. Briggs of Marysville means to send six or eight car loads of pears alone by the 1st of August. Shipments will be made both by slow and fast trains; if the fruit can be delivered in good order by the former, the expense will be less. Each of the truit cars built by the Central Pacific Company can be packed so as to contain sixteen or seventeen tons; but looser packing, to admit of the necessary ventilation, will be the rule, and the amount of fruit to each car will not exceed eight or ten tons. There will probably be forwarded on one day next week not less than fifty or sixty tons of fruit, including peaches, pears, plums, and grapes. As to the prices opinions differ. Whatever may be the precise prices realized. there is a general agreement that a very moderate profit will be a gain, by relieving the market in California. Some of the larger dealers have been trying to utilize the surplus by drying, and the experiment has resulted profitably, but ready sales of the fresh fruit, at even the lowest profit would be preferred by a majority, who have not the capital for large drying operations, and cannot afford to wait on the slower demand for dried fruits. Ultimately, however, the drying of certain fruits. especially figs, for the Eastern market, will become an important feature of the business In view of this, many fig orchards have been planted this year, and it only needs that the curing and packing should be

While California fruit-growers are thus preparing to send East, dealers in the leading Eastern cities are sending inquiries and orders. Some of the queries which have a public interest may be answered in this place. First, as to the leading fruit countries. These are probably Los Angelos, Santa Clara, Alameda, Sonoma, San Joaquim, Sacramento, Yolo, and Yuba, in the valleys, and El Dorado, Placer, Nevada, Calaveras and Butte in the mountains. the valley countries will be found the largest area of orchard and vineyard culture although there are many others, in both the valleys and mountains, which raise fruit largely and ship directly to the chief markets. These markets are San Francisco, Sacramento, Stockton and Marysville.

The first grapes make their appearance from the 1st to the 15th of July, selling from 9 cents to 3 and four cents a pound. gold rates, at wholesale. These are early Sweetwaters; they last but a short time. and will hardly bear transportation to the Eastern side of the continent. The Mission grape, sometimes called the California grape-long the most abundant and popular kind-appears in the market about the 1st of August, wholesaling at 121 cents. and going as low as 3 cents; indeed, it has sometimes retailed as low as 3 cents, buying 8 or 10 pounds together—but this is an extreme price. The Mission grape bears packing well, and is found in the market as late as December. Of the choicest varieties from foreign cuttings, the Black Hamburg, Rose of Peru, and Muscat of Alexandria ripen earliest, appearing in * The accrued interest is added to the prices market from the 15th to the 20th of August of all bonds and debentures sold in this market: and lasting till winter.
