HORRORS OF AN IRISH EVICTION. The Rev. Father Doyle, of Ramsgrange, has furnished some particulars of evictions on the Killesk estate of the Marquis of Ely. writes:-Richard Doyle, a first-class labouring house tumbled down, and all were flung out in the snow. John Tubrit, wife and nine children. driven out in the snowstorm, and house torn down before his face. His poor wife sought to kindle a fire under a neighbouring fence, and to gather her perishing children round it. An aged man, who had 'een much of the world' and of the miseries of life, was present on this awful occasion. He told me when be heard the piteous cries of the little children, saw the distraction of the broken-hearted mother, and the blank despair of the unfortunate father, he could not restrain his tears, but turned with dismay from the sight of calamities he was unable to relieve, and could no longer witness. Poor Tubrit scraped up what took himself to America shortly after. He left his wife and family, in hopes of being able to send for them; but it seems he could not. They are now working up and down, and supporting their aged and delicate mother. No account lately of the poor father. John Furlong and five in family -- some of them mere infants - all flung out in the snowstorm; he sought refuge in the eye of a neighbo ring limekula; there he remained for some time, as he could procure no house elsewhere. In this miserable hole himself, his wife, and children, were haddled together. While he was away at his work his wife went to a neighbouring house on business. The hovel under the kiln was so small that it was dangerous to have fire in it; yet to live without fire was impossible. In the absence of the mother the clothes of a fine boy of three years old caught fire.
