



ANOTHER THAMES TUNNEL. No better proof is needed of English faith in sub-water communication than the

fact that they are now building another tunnel across the Thames River. The work was begun in February last, and is to be completed in November. Only nine months instead of twelve years will thus be consumed in the construction of the enterprise. Furthermore, it is to cost only \$80,000, as against \$2,250,000, the cost of the old tunnel. Of course these differences in the time and cost imply a great difference in the size and method of construction of the two tunnels. The old is a vast elliptical tube of massive brickwork, enclosing two side roadways, each about fourteen feet wide.
