





It is nearly equal in size to the British Black Prince and the Warrior, and exceeds French Gloire and the Normandie. At the time of the flotation the Sebastopel measure 300 feet in length, and her greatest breadth 52 feet 3 inches. The ship draws 26 feet at the poop, and 24 feet at the chains. Her plates are 441 inches thick, fastened to a double coating of tesk from six to nine inches thick.
