

TO THE EDITOR OF THE DAILY NEWS. Sir, -- On Saturday I handed into the Whig office a few lines, in reply to one of its paragraphs, by which it had led the public to believe that Queen's College was legally conferring.Degrees in Medicine upon students of the Kingston private Medical School. The person who edits that paper having first impudently denied what he had said, and then as impudently attempted, by a false state. ment, to prove that what he had said was

right, you will permit me, I trust, the use of I stated in the Whig that in my opinion Queen's College had no power to grant Degrees in Medicine, because she had no Medical Faculty. I made this statement not simply upon my own interpretation of the Charter of Queen's College, but upon the interpretation of it also by the Trustees of Queen's College themselves: for when in 1854, I was requested by the Trustees to institute a Medical Faculty, the Faculty was formed in accordance with their idea, after due consideration of the Charter, that no Degree in Medicine could be conferred, unless the College possessed a body of Medical Professors. As one of the original founders of the College, and taking a deep interest in its prosperity, I was opposed to creating Medical Professorships; because I saw, and so expressed myself, that as such Professors had necessarily to be made of every Medical Tom, Dick and Harry at handmany of whom could have no attachment to the College-they would, as Professors, form part of the College Senate, and thus control the Academical discipline of the Institution. My anticipations in this respect were afterwards fully realized; and the result was that Queen's College was, immediately after my connection with the College ceased, compelled

to get rid of her medico-Professors in a batch, by breaking up the Medical Faculty. The origin of the formation of the defunct Medical Faculty of Queen's College is this :--In 1854, the only College in the Upper Pro-At James S. Yarker's, vince having the power to grant Degrees in Medicine, was Trinity College, Teronto. Trinity would grant Degrees to none but members of the Church of England. Medical students of Trinity, of other religious denominations, who had studied in the Arts' Department of Queen's, applied for relief. That relief was afforded by the formation of the Medical Faculty of Queen's. Now, sir, if Retiring from the Retail Trade Queen's College at that time thought she had the power to confer Degrees in Medicine, without a Medical Faculty, why did she not confer them? The applicants of 1854 had Great Clearing Sale stronger claims upon the College than present applicants: yet, with certificates of having applicants: yet, with certificates of having a full course of Medical study, and other attain. ments necessary for a degree, the applicants of 1854 were compelled to undergo a six months' course in Kingston, the payment of fees to the Medical Professors, and an examin nation by them, which cost some thirty dol-Macnee. & Weddell's. lars. Why was this? Simply, because it was held by the Trustees, that no Medical Degree could be granted without a Medical Faculty. But, answers the legal luminary of the Whigh the Royal Charter of Queen's College, granted in 1841, was altered by a Provincial enactment

The question of right is to be decided by the Charter of the College, and not by a paltry Provincial enactment, incorporating a few traders in physic. Now the preamble states that the Charter is granted for the education of youth in the principles of the Christian Religion; and for their instruction in the various branches of Science and Literature." There is nothing here, nor in any part of the Charter, about "affiliation." . Proceed-PROTECTORS. ing to the 24th clause we find it enacted that "whenever there shall be a Principal and four Professors of the said College, the College Senate shall have power and authority to confer the Degrees of Batchelor, Master and Doctor in the several Arts and Faculties." What Arts and what Faculties? Common sense dictates the answer,-those Arts and Faculties in which "instruction" has been given within the College. And, should a doubt rest upon the mind of any one, the fifth clause may be pointed to, which enacts, with reference to religious tests, that no religious test (except in Divinity), will be required "of or for persons admitted to any Degree in any Art or Faculty therein." As Queen's College has no Medical Faculty "therein," no Medical Degree can be conferred by it. The legality or illegality of the University

of Queen's Collegé conferring Degrees as she is said to be doing, demands the attention not only of other Universities but of the whole Medical Profession. In the Royal Charter, it is expressly stated that the conferring of Degrees ; Divinity shall be according to "Our University in Edinburgh." It might naturally be inferred that other Degrees were to be conferred after the same model. Now "Our University of Edinburgh," from its foundation by James VI., in 1582, to the present time, has never conferred a single Degree in Medicine
