



THURSDAY EVENING, MARCH 20. Model Reformer.—The Crown Lands' Department went through the ordeal of the public accounts on Friday, and some rather peculiar circumstances were disclosed. The Commissioner has over and over again claimed great credit for himself by the largely increased revenue under his management. But the conceit was taken out of him when Mr Richards arose, and showed him by an appeal to figures, that this increase must have come in any event, owing . to the system of regulations adopted under Cardigan Jackets, Polka Jackets, Sontags, the previous Government. He showed conclusively that after deducting the proceeds of the Huron sale, and an amount of \$120,-000 paid in during 1871, but not credited until 1872, the increase was not as large on the percentage as the relation existing between the years 69 and 70. But while the

amount received was no greater, than was

reasonably to be expected, the expense was

something enormous.

Let us look at some of the items of this purely Reform Government. The amount paid for advertising for tenders for coal and wood for the Government House had been inscrited in thirty-seven newspapers, and cost the modest sum of \$640. We do not know how much of the article they use in the Government House, but we are rather inclined to think that \$640 would perhaps be more than the total amount of the contract. But as the tenders were asked for: by Mr McKellar, of course they are all right. However, this is but a trifle com-Pared to the advertising, &c., of the Hon. \$600,000. Commissioner of Crown Lands. To give a MAXWELL W. STRANGE, AGENT. fair view of the economy practised in this department, we sabmit the corresponding item for the years 1869-70-71. The figures were respectively \$553, \$614, and \$797. This was under a Conservative rule. But in 1872 the figures were \$5,001, or more than two and a half times as much as the three preceding years. > CHANGES OF TEMPERATURE DURING THE GERMINATION OF SEEDS .- Prof. Wiesnerthas ascertained that, during the germination of seeds, the temperature increases, before the development of carbonic acid begins, and he believes that water is condensed within the tissues of the seed, and heat thus liberated. He considers this as proof that the increase of temperature is, to a certain extent, independent of the chemical process.
