Of course this growing up nuisance can be put down by the strong arm of the law, and we hope it will be. but how infinitely better, it were to prevent the children from growing into disturbers of the peace by taking care in time to see that they are trained to habits of industry and order. Much has been done in this direction in other places; let us hope that the matter will at once be energetically taken hold of in Kingston. Should the city increase as it is new expected this evil will increase also, unless the vigorous measures are soon taken, and even in a selfish point of view the problem of what measures are to be taken, is one of the most important that can at present engage the attention of our public men.


