The principle of a free school for a free people has taken such deep root on this continent, that it can not longer be delayed on any part of it, and the only wonder was, not that New Brumswick did the deed, but that she so long delayed it.

Be that as it may, the bill became law, and during its discussion the question of separate schools came up. The Roman Catholics declared that if they must be hoped that the Governor General would veto it. We can all remember the outery that was raised about it last session. We know that it formed one of the strongest reasons for rejecting Sir G. E. Cartier in Montreal, and yet the bill was law, and could not be vetoed.
