Governor Bodwell, of Maine, was inaugurated to-day.

The official declaration of the poll in Toronto gives Mayor Howland a majority of 2,195.

Sir Charles Tupper will sail for Canada on the mail steamer leaving Liverpool next Monday.

The minister of finance received a letter from Mr. Mackenzie on Monday containing \$10 "conscience money."

An independent political association upon "Canada first" principles will shortly be established in Toronto.

A slight shock of earthquake occurred at Pango, Texas, yesterday morning and was felt for several miles around.

Seventeen iron shipbuilders have arrived at Lewis, Tenn., from Glasgow to work on Mr. Davis' steamship Titania now in the graving dock.

Trains on the western division of the Canadian Pacific railway have not experienced an hour's delay through snow since the winter set in.

The trustees of four school sections in Goderich township have unanimously voted for the expulsion of the "Rose biber" from their schools.

Eight persons in one family in Brooklyn have been mysteriously poisoned. Two of the sons died yesterday morning, and the death of a third is momentarily expected.

Traffic on the Intercolonial railway has so far been unimpeded by snow, notwithstanding the heavy blockades in the United States.

W. O. Whiting, fancy goods merchant, Yonge street, Toronto, has assigned, and Weeks & Son, jewelers, have called a meeting of their creditors.

THE NEWS FROM ABROAD.

LOUIS NORTHBROOK REFUSES TO JOIN THE BRITISH CABINET.

The Assurance of a Peaceful settlement of European troubles is based on an Irish-Prussian-English alliance.

London, Jan. 5.—Lord Northbrook has decided not to accept the offer of the cabinet. He has written to Mr. Goschen regretting his inability to join the ministry in view of the conservative discontent and the doubtful nature of the agreement with Lord Salisbury.

Dublin, Jan. 6.—The fifty-six men who were arrested last August, at the time Father Fahy was taken into custody for resisting the collection of rates and evictions on the Clonard estate, were yesterday sentenced to various terms of imprisonment, ranging from twelve to eighteen months.

Paris, Jan. 6.—Two English adventures have been arrested here charged with swindling. The prisoners gave the names of Mrs. Linsay and Miss Eynan.

Madrid, Jan. 6.—A band of brigands, which for years has terrorized the inhabitants of the province of Andalusia, was captured on Tuesday after a desperate fight with the police.

Washington, Jan. 6.—A private letter from Buenos Ayres, dated December 10th, states that cholera in its most malignant form is raging there.

London, Jan. 6.—The Vienna correspondent of the Telegraph says: The New Year's day peace assurances appear to have fallen very flat on European financial markets upon public opinion generally.

Constantinople, Jan. 5.—Rustan Pasha, Turkish ambassador to England, has asked the earl of Idelburgh, British minister of foreign affairs, whether the English government inspired the articles in the London press urging the partition of the Balkan peninsula.

Pittsburg, Jan. 6.—A natural gas explosion at this morning, destroyed the new Andrew's block and four other buildings. Thomas Brannigan, aged nineteen years, was seriously injured.
