A "Friendly Inn" for Wayfarers, "It is with a confident air," remarks a Pittsburg humorist, "that a tramp asks to be permitted to saw wood for his breakfast supposing his object to be to receive the charity and shirk the labor—if he made such its good work. The managers of the inn issue tickets at the nominal price of ten cents each, which they ask the public to buy and to give to able bodied tramps when accested instead of money. The ticket presented at the institution insures the bearer an opportunity to saw and split wood enough to pay for his lodging and breakfast.

In addition to a comfortable lodging and wholesome food a pleasant sitting room is provided for the wayfarers, together with a bath and a place to wash and dry their clothes; for which the are enabled and expetced to give an equivalent in honest work. The store kindling wood thus produced is sold to the citizens of Minneapolis at a moderate price. Persons desiring help for odd jobs of various kinds are also asked to apply at the Friendly Inn. In the course of a year the institution furnishes about 8,000 meals and 5,000 nights' lodgings to able bodied




