

What the federationists want is to sow the seed and let it take root and grow in men's minds. It is not to be expected that it will spring into prominence in one night, like a mushroon. What we require is something that will bring us all together not merely by sentiment but by common interest. With regard to the project of changing the house of fords into an imperial senate he feared

there were great and insuperable objections. The house of lords does now command the respect the British nation, and the feeling of jealousy was not confined to the house of commons alone, but was general throughout the country. Many now want an elective senate, while others want but one house. With regard to the proposed parliament, there are only two ways to be thought of, either let the present parliament delegate its powers, or create a new parliament. He thought that election for life would not meet with favor from the British puolic, and he favored the system which prevailed in some of the states in the adjoining republic, in which the sensaors were elected for six years, one third retiring every two years thus giving a stability to the institution.
