A Curious Libel Suit.
New Haven, Conn., April 22.—George H. Ford, proprietor of a fashionable jewelry establishment here, has brought suit for \$10,000 for libel against the New Haven Union. Ford was on the invitation committee appointed in connection with the proposed unveiling of a soldiers' monument here in June. He and a local artist designed and executed a gorgeous invitation to President and Mrs. Cleveland to attend the ceremonies, and placed it on exhibition in the window of his store. While it was thus displayed, it was read by a woman who was ungrammatical, and the Union called attention to it through its columns. The gentlemen in charge of the arrangements for the day had another invitation prepared, which was recently received, and which was read by Mr. O'Brien. Ford claims that the Union has held him up for "ridicule" and contempt.

LONDON, April 21.—In the House of Lords today Earl Cadogan moved the second reading of the Earl O'Brien bill.
Baron DeMaistre moved the rejection of the bill, which he said, was likely to bring land-owners and tenants into litigation.
Earl Spencer said that land question must be settled before Ireland would be reconciled to the interference with rents was unavoidable. He declared that the bankruptcy clauses of the bill would utterly demoralize the Irish people. The Earl of Salisbury, who said that, in the interests of the landlords, the bankruptcy clauses ought to be reconsidered.
Baron Fitzgibbon condemned the bill as too complicated to work with ease and safety. Mr. Ashbourne said the bill, if passed, would prove a great check to evictions.

When Says it is a Forgery.

A Complicated Case.
A Woman, While Waiting a Divorce, Dies, Married Twice.
KINGSTON, N.Y., April 21.—A case was tried today before Judge Parker, that involves the estate of a woman who died in the United States. In 1876 Anne Thomas, an English lady, married one Tate in Yorkshire, England, and in 1878 entered an action for divorce on the grounds of adultery. On May 7, 1879, the court ordered that the marriage should be dissolved, and that she should be allowed to marry again. She then went to Ontario and at Southampton married one Aves, who is at present living in Kingston. She then returned to England and married one Stewart, who is at present living in the United States. The court has ordered that the marriage with Aves is null and void, and that she is free to marry again.

Being suspicious, Prof. Sanford shook the box and a few grains of gunpowder fell out. Upon close examination he discovered several matches, so arranged as to be ignited when the drawer was opened. He threw the box into the door yard, when an explosion occurred, which shattered the windows of an adjacent house. There is no known motive for the attempted outrage.
