At least four hundred children are

down with the measles in the city of

Madison, Wisconsin, and many adults are

afflicted. The public schools have been closed.

The race for the 2000 guineas stakes for

three years was run to-day at Newmarket and won by Heidi, Enterprize, Fenwick's Phil, second, and Perkins' Elegance third.

The government has prevented the Rus-

sian admiral of General Boulangers from

sending him a sword of honor on the

ground that such an act would create or-

renous impressions in regard to Russia's

foreign policy.

It is stated in Berlin that the result of

the inquiry which the German govern-

ment has made into the Schneiders

affair has been to impress Prince Bismarck

with the view that the arrest was made on

German territory.

Track laying on the West Ontario

Railway is proceeding at the rate of

a mile a day. The road was finished

to within ten miles of London yesterday,

and by the end of next week the rails will

be laid into that city if no unforeseen delay

occurs.

The dead body of the wife of one Ber-

nard Kennedy, a dairy keeper, was found

five miles from Dubuque, Iowa, yester-

day. The woman's head had been badly

crushed, one eye being knocked out, and

broke evidence of the use of a heavy

bludgeon.

The London Times' Vienna corre-

spondent bewails the superseding of Mr.

Lee, who he says, after being officially

and socially received as United States

minister, cannot well remain as secretary

of the legation. Mr. Lee will soon leave

the city.

James Johnston, one of the trustees of

ronto, was charged at the police court this
