Tobacco Growing Falling Off.

Louisville, June 6.—The Courier Journal publishes special reports from over one hundred counties in Kentucky, Tennessee, Georgia, Indiana, Alabama and Mississippi relative to the condition of farming operations. Labor as a rule is stated to be ample for all purposes. The recent drop in prices for tobacco has resulted in many Kentucky producers abandoning its cultivation for this season. The indications point to a crop of not exceeding 60 per cent. of that of last year. The frost in April injured fruit to such an extent that there will be few peaches and only about a half crop of apples. Wheat, corn and the other cereals promise an average yield. There is a general complaint of drought which is attributed to the retarded growth of corn and cotton.

In Imminent Danger.

Vienna, June 6.—The sluices at Pargany, a few miles from Osegedin, show signs of collapsing, and two hundred workmen are raising a new dyke to protect them. Five thousand acres of land belonging to Count Karoly are in great danger of being flooded. The inhabitants of Vasarehy have, on account of the danger, been prevented from sleeping for several nights. The waters are rising at the rate of twenty inches per day. New dykes were built at Osegedin, but the citizens of Mako, with the mayor at their head, came at night and demolished them, believing they increased ten fold the danger to Mako.

Troubled With Too Much.

Philadelphia, June 6.—Secretary of the Treasury Fairchild, in an interview with the Washington correspondent of the Times, said: It is an extraordinary state of affairs in the financial condition of the great nations of the world, that while some are exercising all sorts of ingenuity in their efforts to secure means to meet their obligations, we are troubled with anxiety as to what to do with our surplus revenues. While they are perplexed with the inconvenience of not enough we are troubled with too much.
