Such appiintments have already been made, but not in a way to offer encoure agement to cadets such as would be given them were the positions offered as prizes.

THE PROPOSED DRY DOCK. A public meeting is called for Wednes day to discuss the building of a dry dock It is, of course, impossible to know in advance just what direction the discussion will take, but this idea should be kept well to the front-the dry dock should be built here. There is no other pointon the lakes where such an institution could be located with so much advantage both to mariners and the operators of the dock. It would give employment to a number of workingmen and add to the population and trade of the city. 
