It will be seen that the list embraces a variety of examples, kindly sent us by the Superintendent of the Ottawa Water Works, viz: The rates of two Private Residents, one Saloon, one Hardware Store, one Dry Goods Shop, one Law Office, one Grocery Store, two Banks, two Printing Offices, and two Hotels.

It will be seen that not in a single instance does the Kingston rate exceed that of Ottawa, where, it is said, "the rates are considered low, and are paid with a murmur."
