Dr. Shaw, president of the Methodist conference, and other influential friends of the Indians in this city have been in consultation as to the best measures to adopt in the interests of the Indians Conferences ities and a number of propositions have on agreed upon and submitted to the dians for their consideration. They are ractically a renewal of the propositions nade a couple of years ago that the Indians shall quit the reserve, nd be given lands in Muskoka or some bur suitable location, receiving compention for the lands and houses now occupied y them There are at present about two undred and fifty Protestant Indians and orhaps a hundred Roman Catholic Inians on the reserve. The Indians occupy aps of land which they cultivate, while e Indian women engage in making lamase sticks and fancy articles There a good deal of feeling amongst the

community offers as compensation \$10 an Indians say is worth at least \$30 or \$40 an acre, and they do not seem prepared o accept the propositions as they now atand. The Indian council has held several meetings to consider the matter, bu as yet no decision has been arrived at. It is believed, however, that a good many of them would prefer to quit the reserve and take up homes where they would have greater freedom of action, and be all wed to worship as they saw fit.
