MCGARIGLE IS LYING LOW.
DURING THE NIGHT HE HURRIES
INTO OBSCURITY.

An Order from Chicago for His Arrest,
Which is Not Executed. His Whereabouts at Present Unknown, But He is
Believed to be Near Sarnia.

SARNIA, Aug. 1.—At midnight last night the Chief of Police received a telegram from State's Attorney Grinnell ordering McGarigle's immediate arrest on an indictment got out in Montreal. All the telegram did not state the nature of the charge. Chief Windred hesitated about making the arrest. He, however, went at 2 a.m. to the house where McGarigle was supposed to be staying over night, and found upon investigation that he had gone, no person could or would tell where.

This morning two detectives arrived from Chicago to watch McGarigle's movements, and it is said they have devised a scheme to take him to the other side.
