Winston, N. C., Feb. 22.—A bar-tender in Winston, N. C., was killed this morning by a falling bottle.

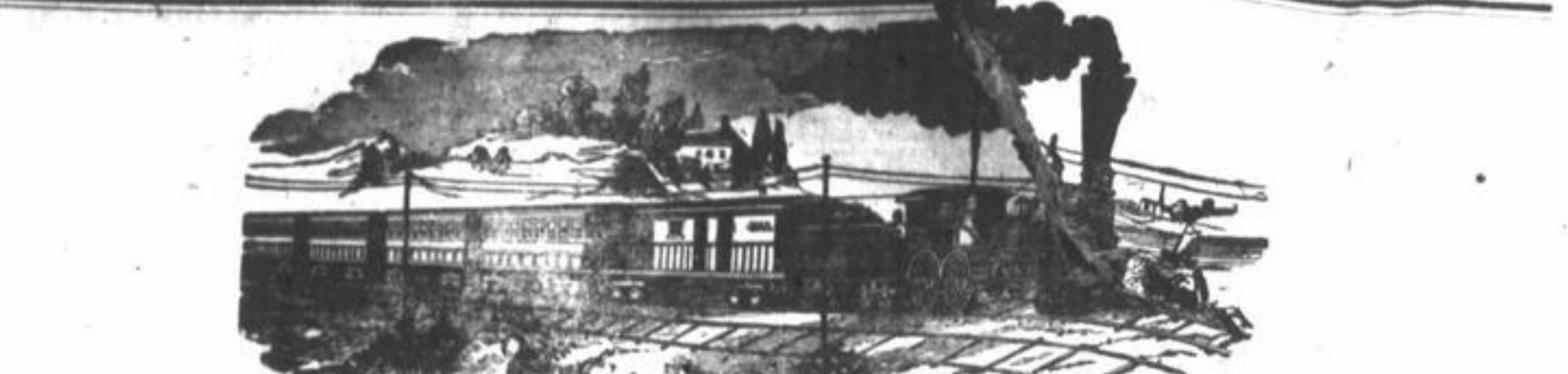
Notes From the Capital.
