verdict of Manslaughter, but strongly recommended the prisoner to mercy. His Lordship, in passing sentence, made some pertinent remarks on the crime of homi-

cide, and addressing the prisoner said-

"In your case there are some ei cumstances which extenuate the crime, and the Court take into consideration the recommendation of the jury.
