That it he resolved, that while it is neces sary for the independent discharge of the hig' functions of the Legislature, that the privilege of Parliament should remain undefined an subject to the sole abjudication of the Representatives of the people, in whose behalf these privileges have always been asserted and maintained; yet it, is equally necessary for giving that moral weight to their proceedings, which an unobstructed publicity alone can ensue; that every reasonable faculty should he afforded to the public, and especially to those connected with the press, to be present at their deliberations, and that to meet, as far as practicable, the well known wishes of the people in this respect, suitable and convenient accommodation under the direction of the Speaker, in such part of the House as shall be most free from interruption to those who may be employed by the press to attend there while the doors are open, subject, nevertheless to the orders of this House. After a long discussion it was lost in a vote of 54 to 7; the following are the yeas: - Boulton of Norfolk, Boulton of Toronto, Cameron of Kent, Ferguson, Holmes, Perry, and Smith of Durham.
