A ROTTEN STOCK SPECULATION. NEW YORK, Jan. 8. - The Herald publishes a long article on the operations of the Cameron coal company. It says the lands of the company are located in the wild mountainous region of north-western Pennsylvania. The company did practically nothing for two years, and is doing nothing now, but in Wall street it appears to be very busy indeed. The stock, which two years ago was quoted on the New York stock exchange at 3 per cent, and one year ago at 9 per cent, is being manipulated, so that it is now above 44. The company is capitalized at \$2,500,000, in shares of \$50 each. The total amount is entered for dealings on the regular New York stock exchange. Besides this there is a mortgage of \$500,000 upon the property. The estimated value of everything the company owns does not exceed \$25,000, and if sold now probably would not bring much more than half that sum.
