Stray Paragraphs and Items of Interest Gleaned from Various Sources. In Montana a great many miners receive \$1.50 a day. It is estimated that 200 lives were lost in Germany by the recent heavy snow storm. The newest kind of a thief is one in Bellevue, O., who steals thermometers exclusively. The roof of the pension office at Washington leaks with every rain storm and melting snow. In Hollister, Cal., a Chinaman is organizing a Masonic lodge for the benefit of his countrymen. A Boston dentist pulled the wrong tooth and was compelled to pay \$150 damages to his victim. The first invoice of feathers was received at San Diego, Cal., from the ostrich farm at Mount Fairview. Efforts are being made to make Santa Ana, in Los Angeles county, a general fruit depot for southern California. The Buffalo Courier suggests that free passes be given to every theatre-going woman who will doff her hat. There are only twenty horses in Buffalo. One day recently every one of them was in use, and at the same hour. A great religious revival is sweeping over northern New Brunswick. 'It is said to be unequalled in the history of the province. An artesian well at Portland, Ore., is down 1,500 feet and has cost so far \$18,000, with no prospect yet of securing a good flow of water. The Philadelphia Humane society keeps a boat on runners at the skating club's house on the Schuylkill ready to rescue any one who breaks through the ice. The average salary of school teachers in St. Louis is \$637.50. Only twenty-six receive \$2,000 per year. Of 1,101 teachers 1,004 receive less than \$900 per year. American gentlemen desirous of attaining the honor of knighthood should seek the Sandwich Islands. King Kalakoua has a stock of ribbons on hand which can be had cheap. There are now under contract to be completed during the present winter for service principally on Lake Superior twenty-eight new vessels, having an aggregate capacity of 43,000 tons. It is not every day that men-of-war are named after literary men. Admiral Aube, the French minister of marine, has just named the first gunboat of a new type the Gabriel Charrier. A servant girl in Cincinnati has fallen heir to \$250,000, and the family where she has been employed have invited her to occupy the spare room and help receive company.—New Haven News. A citizen of Hanover, Kan., gets his mail at the postoffice quarterly. About every three months, after being notified two or three times that his box is full, he goes and takes the contents away. It is complained in New York that some of the press accounts of recent parties and receptions mentioned as being present the names of ladies who were dead, ladies who were in Europe and ladies who were under a cloud. J. Goldborough Druff has presented to congress a memorial asking for the adoption of a new design for the great seal of the United States. He points out what he considers grave heralric defects in the present seal. I have often wondered that the magazines, in their quest for novelty in illustrations, have not turned their attention to Ireland. The green isle is a mine for the artist and the writer. I understand, however, that one of the English magazines is now preparing a series of articles on the subject, and that one of our own chief periodicals is also gathering material to the same end. A Holyoke (Mass.) thread manufacturer has received from Leeds a large skein of black silk which has lain in a pond since the Mill river disaster, which wrecked his mill, with others, in 1874. This souvenir of the flood was found Sept. 5, and although it has lain in the pond two years the silk retains its color, has a good gloss, and the thread is strong, which shows the almost indestructible nature of the material. At a recent literary entertainment given by the students of Great University, at Athens, Ga., Miss McLane was to recite. As she walked upon the stage she was in apparent good health, and was giving her recitation successfully, when suddenly she stopped, played her hands over her face and stood silent. She was led from the stage, and then it was ascertained that she had become totally blind.—New York Sun.

It has been proposed to run steamships direct from New York to Palatka, Fla., 100 miles up the St. John's river, but the run has not been attempted by the vessels now running to Jacksonville because of the mud some ten miles below Palatka, on which the water is only about ten feet deep. But two old river captains say that the mud is really no obstacle to steam navigation, and that they have often piloted boats drawing fourteen feet—ten of water and four of mud—over the shoals.—New York Sun.
