

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR.

The Mill Employees, KINGSTON, Feb. 19. - (To the Editor): In a recent issue of the News a letter appeared signed, "A Knitting Mill Girl." Now as I know the girls of the knitting mill I know that none of them are ambitious of having their names in print even in defence of the N.P. It may be true that under the N.P. the industries of Canada have been fostered, but I doubt if the manufacturers of cotton or woolen goods would have continued the manufacture of the goods if it was not for their own pecemiary advantage instead of the advantage of their employees. The writer of the letter says that before the introduction of the N.P., the girls had to go to the United States to get work. Well if they did go, they got, and still get, three times the wages for their work they had in the mills here. It is to be hoped that the manufacture of both cotten mill and woolen goods will go on and prosper, but I do not think it right that the manufacturers should claim to be the benefactors of the working classes. I think they must acknowledge that they pay no more than they can help, and that the girls work for all they get. ONE WHO KNOWS.
