THE KINGSTON MARKET. KINGSTON, March 9.—The mild weather has caused a drop in the price of butter. Packed butter only brings 15c to 18c per lb.

Beef is going off slowly. Fore quarters are selling at 3c to 5c per lb., and hind quarters at 4c to 6c per lb. Butchers pay \$7 per cwt. for the carcasses of western fat cattle.

Barley is selling at 12c per lb. by the box, or 15c by the pound when cut. The cable quotations remain at 64s per cwt. There has been little change in the price of vegetables, quoted last week.
