ASTRONOMICAL SUBJECT.

Two Leading Questions Answered What we are Said to be Coming to.

"And, like the baseless fabric of this vision. The cloud capp'd towers, the gorgeous pa-The solemn temples, the great globe itself, Yea, all which it inherit, shall dissolve,

And, like this insubstantial pageant faded, Leave not a rack behind." SHAKESPEARE. What is the cause of the earth's motion

round the sun? Will the earth eventually fall into the sun? The above questions have appeared in several newspapers recently, and the answers given are not as clear from a scientific standpoint as might be. Of course nothing definite can be arrived at of the modus operandi of the law or laws which developed the heavenly bodies from the crude elements of eternal space, or as to their ultimate destination. All that can be done in the premises, with the light we have, is to build up a rational theory, based on observation and scientific research into the varied phenomena of nature. We should then, by arriving at a possible theory of the causes which developed those millions of heavenly bodies, be more able to comprehend the principles which cause their disintegration and ultimate destiny. It is conceded by scientists that space is eternal, (having no conceivable limits); that space is filled with matter, dense and attenuated, the former being the heavenly bodies and the latter attenuated gases; that motion pervades all space ; and that heat is motion. Helmholtz and Tyndall say that heat is motion and no thing else; that heat is the only known active agent in the universe, communicating to, or infusing life and motion into, matter in some of its forms, as heat manifests itself variously, as energy, electricity, light, gal vanism, magnetism, etc. These give rise to the development of what is known as nebulous matter, which aggregate in masses, occupying immense areas in space. These masses being suns in embryo, and composed of particles of partially condensed matter and heat, a circular motion is set up, caused by its particles drawn towards the centre by the principle of what we term gravitation. The same motion is observed in he whirlpool, caused by the same law. Finally this chaotic mass assumes a spherical form, which we will, for illustration, call the sun. How long it required to gather to its body all this mass of nebular to complete its growth can never be conjectured. Herbert Spencer says "everything grows," and the heavenly bodies are no exception. But the probabilities are the growth must have taken millions of ages. Now this spherical condition we will term its adult growth, and turning on its axes, making one revolution in about two hundred years, its bulk, or dimensions, reaching far beyond the furthermost planet, fills all the space in the interval. The orbit which the earth rolled in at that time, was not far from the centre

of this vast luminous body. At the same time the sun was a highly heated globe, had not as yet given birth to a planet. But now antagonistic laws commenced to operate. Seggregation sets up its claim, also the low temperature surrounding it, absorbing heat from its surface, causing its bulk to contract thereby increasing its motion on its axes, at the same time increasing its centrifugal force on the surface. These causes produced a ridge or swelling on the sun'ssurface at its equator, and, the same forces continuing, the sun shrinking away from the ridge, owing to its continual diminution from loss of heat, and the increase of centrifugal force, the ridge became detached from the parent body and became a ring, but continued to revolve round the sun's body, as when attached, but at less speed. And the possibilities are it would have remained a ring to this day, had all its parts been equally poised, but owing

to uneven density in its parts, causing an attraction to the more dense parts, established a circular motion throughout the mass, resulting in a globular body, its evolus tion being continued on its newly established axes round the sun s body, making the location which the ring previously occupied its orbit. It may be here mentioned that the reason the rings around the planet Saturn remain entire to this day, in the form the planets left them, without taking the globular form, like the satellites, is, no doubt, due to all their parts remaining in perfect equilibrium. It follows that the same principles that gave birth to the first planet of the solar system, develope all the others, and the latter their satellites by the same laws. But the sun has not parted with those bodies without suffering great diminution in its body. The sun is now estimated at less than one million of miles in diameter, whereas it must have measured many thousands of millions previous to its giving birth to its first planet. Again, it takes now about eight days to make a revolution on its axis; whereas, when at its largest diameter, it required about twf hundred years. We come now to the first question. What is the cause of the earth's moving round the sun? We must view the whole of the s lar system as one vast body, from the centre of which radiates the force throughout the entire body. That force is heat in some form; it may be energy, magnetism or electricity. It is a significant fact that all the members of the body turn in one direction, from west to east. It will be understood that long ages intervened between the birth of the planets. The diameters of the different orbits of the respective planets indicate the diameter of the sun at the time the former left the latter's surface. To keep in motion the machinery of so vast a system for almost untold ages, was not performed without a corresponding loss of heat. Every physiologist knows there cannot be the slightest motion in animal or plant organisms that is not at the expense of heat, or some form of heat. So that since the sun aggregated all the nebulous particles within its gravitating influence and become a

perfectly spherical body having nothing more to feed on, so to speak -commenced disintegrating its body, by giving birth to worlds, and furnishing material (heat) for the maintenance of life and motion in them, literally living on its own body. The second question is: Shall the earth eventually fall into the sun ! According to the nebular hypothesis at the time of the sun's developement, from nebulous matter, its immense dimensions would indicate that it contained a much larger amount of heat than it does at the present time. What, then, has become of the loss? Part of it is still retained by its planets and satellites, but by far the greater portion has, after performing its necessary functions throughout its planetary system, giving life and motion to, what, without heat, would be lifeless matter, has passed into boundless space, available, when the necessary conditions arise, of infusing motion into lifeless matter (gases) for the development of new worlds. Prof. Tyndall says of heat : "It comes to us as heat, and leaves us as heat, but while it remains with us, it performs all those wonderful phenomena that is every-

where apparent." It will now be seen the

sun has lost, and is constantly losing, heat,

drain on its reserve energy at the centre of its system. Besides a steady expenditure of energy there is the resistance the planets have to overcome in the form of attenuated matter in moving round their orbits. There is, also, what is called centripetal force gravitation. All these resisting forces against the motor force have been in the ascendancy ever since the sun reached its globular form, and they still maintain the ascendancy. By this means they are steadily minimising the speed of the planets in their orbits, reducing the centrifugal force of the former, and gradually circumscribing their orbits. It must, therefore, be only a question of time, when fate will precipitate the planets and their satellites into the sun, there, with the sun itself, to be disintegrated into their original elements, to be again available for manipulation into new or ganisms, the same routine which their elements no doubt have passed through thousands of times previously. And so from everlasting to everlasting, does countless cycles come and go, and yet matter and heat are no less now than they were ten thousand ages in the past, nor will they be in the slightest degree diminished in ten thousand ages in the future.

The idea of the disintegration of organic forms of matter, must have impressed the mind of Avon's bard, when he penned the

lines at the head of this letter, -C. McM. P.S. -- The above has reference only to our solar system, of which the earth is but an insignificant part, and yet the entire solar system-whose vastness is such, to fully realize it seems almost impossible—in comparison with the hosts of heavenly bodies floating in space, is but a single grain of and on the shores of the ocean. Every star within our vision, with the exception of our own planets, is supposed to be a sun, with its train of planets similar to our own system. -C. MeM.
