The remains of Mrs. John Butler, who died recently, were deposited in the R. C. vault, Centreville. The deceased lady was the last of four sisters.

General regret is expressed among the members of Grace church, Gananoque, at the prospect of losing Rev. W. Hall, whose time expires in June.

The petition, asking the N. T. & Q. R. Y authorities to re-instate Mr. Glenn as station agent at Tamworth, had a good effect, as he will remain there.

The young people of Lansdowne, comprising Rev. Mr. Tighe's bible class, on Thursday presented him with an arm chair, and Mrs. Tighe with a breakfast set.

Thomas McGuire has sold the temperance hotel, "Lanark," to Archibald Daron. Mr. McGuire has bought the Hall property in the same village from the owner.
