LANSDOWNE'S ESTATES.

Evictions Which Threaten to Convulse the Country and Make Much Trouble.

NEW YORK, March 26.-T. P. Gill, M.P., has cabled the Tribane of this city that the most important event of the week for Ireland was the evictions on Lcrd Lansdowne's Queens county estate. Through his agent, Townsend Trench, the governor has refused to grant a reduction, although on several properties adjoining his the land courts have reduced rents by 40 per cent. His tenants demanded a reduction of 20 per cent. on judicial or revised, and 30 per cent. on non-judicial or unrevised rents, and, on this being refused, adopted the plan of campaign. The first eviction was carried out at Luggacurran against the principal tenant, Mr. Kilbride. Proclamations were posted forbidding any expression of public opinion in regard to evictions. An immense force of police was drafted to the scene, and a large gang of emergency men broke in the doors, windows and roof of Mr. Kilbride's house, and, flinging out the furniture, smashed it to pieces. Mr. William O'Brien, editor of *United Ireland*, arrived from Dublin, and his exertions, with those of the priests, prevented a collision with the armed forces. When the eviction was completed they managed to hold a meeting and assert the right of free speech notwithstanding the

Mr. O'Brien requests me to cable to America as his appeal to the Canadian people : "Lord Lansdowne has refused one farthing reduction on the judicial rents, which even the Cowper commission declared excessive. I have to day witnessed barbarous evictions on Lord Lansdowne's estate in Queens county. I respectfully appeal to the people of Canada, who have always displayed generous sympathy with Ireland, whether they will tolerate their governor-general's campaign of extermination against his tenantry for non-payment of crushing rack-rents.

Mr. O'Brien will go to Canada to challenge public opinion on the action of the governor general.

A TRUE BILL FOUND.

Hon, John Costigan Charged with Fe sonal Bribery by the Victoria Grand Jury. EDMUNSTON, N.B., March 25 .- The grand jury of Victoria county have found a true bill of indictment against Hon. John Costigan, minister of inland revenue, for personal bribery, and a summons was ordered to issue against him for trial at the next court, which will be held on the 28th June. A true bill was also found against Mr. Costigan's chief canvassar, Victory Albert, for bribery. On Mr. Costigan's return his disqualification will be asked for. It will be remembered that during the election cant paign it was charged that Mr. Costigan had offered his opponent, Mr. Theriault, \$5,000 to retire from the field, and the offer was refused. Ms. Costigan had any amount of boodle, but still his majority was reduced from five hundred to two hundred. His deposit of \$200 was made by himself and not by his agent, and this, according to the rule of the tory returning officer in Queen's county, should give the seat to Mr. Theriault. There is great excitement thoroughout the county over the exposure of the means by which the minister secured his re-election. OTTAWA, March 25. - Hon, John Costigan has received no news of the matter. He denies all charges of bribery.
