rubbish of carpenter and mason's work. The door was off. The plumbers had torn up the floor. The roof was being lifted in cupola. All the pictures were gone, and the paper hangers were doing their work. All the modern improvements were being introduced into that dwelling. There was not a room in the house fit to live in at that time, although a month before when I visited that house everything was so beautiful I could not but have suggested an improvement. My friend had gone with his family to the Holy Land, expecting to come back at the end of six months, when the building was to be done. And oh, what was his joy when at the end of six months, he returned and the old house was enlarged and improved and glorified. That is your body. It looks well now—all the rooms filled with health, and we could hardly make a suggestion. But after a while your soul will go to the Holy Land, and while you are gone the old house of your tabernacle will be entirely reconstructed from cellar to attic, and every nerve, muscle and bone and tissue and artery must be hauled over, and the old structure will be furnished and adorned and raised and cupolaed and enlarged, and all the improvements of heaven introduced and you will move into it on resurrection day. For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. Oh, what a day when body and soul meet again! They are very fond of each other. Did your body ever have pain and your soul not pity it? or your body have a joy and your soul not rejoice in it? or, changing the question, did your soul ever have any trouble and your body not sympathize with it? growing wan and weak under the depressing influence. Or did your soul ever have a gladness but your body celebrated it with kindled eye and cheek and elastic step? Surely, God never intended two such good friends to be very long separated. And so when the world's last Easter morning shall come the soul will descend, crying, "Where is my body?" and the body will ascend, saying, "Where is my soul?" And the Lord of the resurrection will bring them together, and it will be a perfect soul in a perfect body, introduced by a perfect Christ into a perfect heaven. Victory! Do you wonder that to-day we swathe this house with garlands? Do you wonder we celebrate it with the most consecrated voice of song that we can invite, and with the dearest fingers on organ and cornet, and with doxologies that beat these arches with the billows of sound as the sea snatches the basalt at Giant's Causeway! 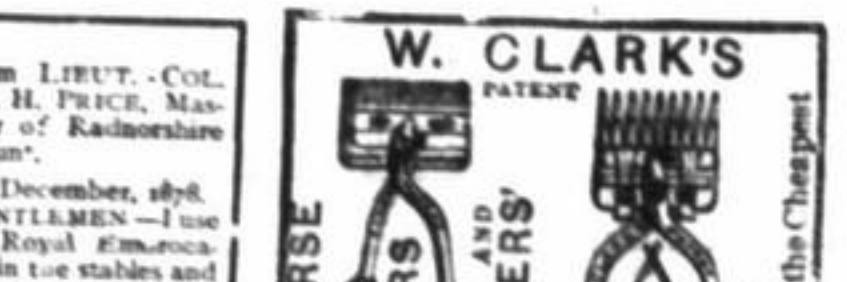

PARNELL ON THE LAND BILL.

His Views Upon This Very Important Matter—A Villainous Plot.

NEW YORK, April 8.—The Tribune has a despatch from T. P. Gill, M.P., giving Mr. Parnell's views on the land bill as expressed in an interview. Following is an extract: Mr. Gill—Would not an outbreak of crime have an unfortunate effect upon English opinion?

Mr. Parnell—Yes, it would be most unfortunate. Crime would shock and revolt English opinion and postpone home rule some time, perhaps too long; perhaps till Mr. Gladstone's political life were over. This is the calculation of these miserable politicians who had formed this villainous plot against the liberties and happiness of a nation for the sake of keeping themselves in office for a few years. I believe, however, that our people will, as I said in my speech the other night, hearken to Mr. Gladstone's voice where he pointed out to them how powerfully the peaceable state of Ireland had enabled him and the liberal party to take and maintain their strong stand against coercion.

Mr. Gill—What is your opinion of the government land bill? Mr. Parnell—The clauses regarding leaseholders are taken almost word for word from my bill of last session, except that some limitations in mine favorable to the tenants are not contained in the bill of the government. These provisions concerning leaseholders are, of course, favorable if they be fairly administered, and we shall support them; but there is much reason to doubt whether they will be fairly administered. One of the first effects of the new bill would be the supercession of the great bulk of the present land commissioners, who have recently been giving large abatements, and who are as a result out of favor at the castle. In their stead would be appointed a set of thorough-going landlord partisans, who would perform function of rent reduction on a minimum scale. As for the rest of the measure it is a mere trap.
