ALL AROUND THE HOUSE.

Up Stairs, Down Stairs, in Kitchen and in the Lady's Parlor.

Designs in stained glass are made up by combinations of small pieces of different colors. Until of late it was necessary to make a framework of lead conforming in size and shape to the pieces of glass used, each piece being fitted to the place for which it was intended and secured by soldering. This method was both laborious and tedious. By a new process the glass is laid in position according to the design, leaving sufficient space between the pieces for the introduction of the molten metal which is to fasten them together. In this condition the design is placed in suitable clamps and the metal poured in, finding its way into every crevice and resulting in a solid piece of workmanship. The time usually required in making a casting is about five minutes, and the smallest pieces of glass are securely attached to the mass without the disfigurement of the heavy lines seen in designs made by the old process.

The Damp Cloth System.

Helen Campbell claims, with truth, that sweeping is far less a frequent need than is supposed. The dust must be removed, but a damp cloth is a key to its removal, and the damp cloth system a saving of much hard labor as well as wear and tear to the carpets. Says the authority mentioned: Put a spoonful of ammonia in half a pail of warm water, and wipe the carpet with a cloth wrung out from this water. The dust is removed, the colors freshened and every stray moth-a possibility everywhere in these days of furnaces—finds a sudden end. Fluff, insidious and unconquerable, forming itself in mysterious rolls under beds and in corners, is reduced to its lowest terms, sinks into almost impalpable unpleasantness before the damp cloth, instead of sailing triumphantly before the broom. The broom will still be an essential, but as servant, not monarch, and even where one, can not afford a carpet sweeper need never again involve the amount of hard work associated with it.

Wall Paper in Nurseries.

It is important to know that the walls of a nursery are harmless. It has more than once happened that children have ailed mysteriously from injurious wall papers, and the brighter and prettier the paper very often the more risk there is of danger. Nothing is more cheerful or more wholesome than a light color wash. It can at any time be washed and kept sweet and clean. It holds no infection, like paper, in case of the epidemics to which children are so liable, and it offers a good background for the picture which should always adorn a nursery.

Hauging Pictures.

Small pictures should never be hung below large heavy ones. The latter appear best in narrow spaces between moldings and other convenient nooks, or, if of high merit, resting on cabinets or mantels. In all cases these should be as near as possible in line with the eye. A single subject vividly portraved may even be mounted over the door.

Decorative Doilies.

The cut here given represents doilies made of fine glossy linen and ornamented with designs outlined with colored filosel silk.



DOILIES OUTLINED WITH SILK. The doilies, if made to measure eight inches square inclusive of the fringe, will be found of convenient size for the uses to which these dainty articles are usually applied.

How to Utilize Old Flannel.

Old flannel of all kinds should be kept for scrubbing and cleaning paint; undervests, drawers, skirts, all come in for it. In England, where scrubbing is still the glory of the poorer people, cottages vying with each other on the color of their boards, there is a coarse, gray flannel made called "house flannel," expressly for the purpose. Next to flannel is old, coarse, soft linen, old kitchen towels, In addition to the soft, wet cloth a dry rub-

ber (best made of old Russian crash that has done service for round or dish towel) should be kept; a scrubbing brush of hard bristles is best; the soft excelsior brushes are of little use except for coarse paint, and brushes made of broom straw, although not entirely satisfactory, are about the best one can get when bristle brushes are not to be had, or are too

Miss Parloa's Ice Cream Cake.

Ice cream cake, named from its delicacy. requires, according to Miss Parloa's recipe, one cup of butter, one and a half of sugar, two flour, half a cup of milk, whites of five eggs, two level teaspoonfuls of baking powder, half a teaspoonful of vanilla extract. Baked twenty-five minutes in a moderate oven, which gives a tender, fine grained cake, while a hot one makes cake coarse and tough. Sprinkle sugar over cake that is not to be frosted, going into the oven, to make a rich, nice crust. Beat very little after the flour is worked in, only three or four strokes, as beating makes cake finer but tougher and dryer. Mind this with sponge cake. A little water set in the oven gives moister cake.

Simmering Versus Boiling.

In all ordinary cookery simmering at 180 degs, is more effective than violent boiling at 213 degs. The heat that is applied to do more than the smallest degree of simmering is simply wasted in converting water into useless steam. For instance, if stewed chicken is ordered and happens to be late, it is cut apart, thrown into boiling water and boiled at a gallop for an hour, then served with an apology that there was not time to cook it tender; when that same chicken, if thrown into boiling water and then pushed back where it could not possibly boil, would have been tender, more juicy and higher flavored in less than the hour.

Corn Starch Cake. One cup of butter worked to a cream with two cups of sugar; one cup of milk in which is dissolved one teaspoonful of soda; two cups of flour, in which is sifted two teaspoonfuls of cream of tartar; the whites, only, of six eggs, beaten to a stiff froth. Mix all these ingredients well, then add one cup of corn starch. Beat well. Bake in a moderate oven. Will

make one large loaf.

Baked Macaroni. Bake the macaroni in water until tender; mix a dessertspoonful of flour with a tablespoonful of butter; add one cup of salt, onehalf teaspoonful of mustard, salt and pepper and one-half pound of grated choose. Boll all together ten minutes and pour on the maca-
