Louis Rousseau has traded his premises to J. B. Rousseau for the Cape Vincent hotel. Mr. Taylor's election expenses in Leeds amounted to \$383.42 and Mr. Britton's to \$372.88.

Dr. J. Chaisey is practicing dentistry in Newark, N. J. He hails from Prince Edward county.

A. H. Saylor, Coneseon, has commenced building a large brick terrace and a large store house.

Sunday last was the fifty-ninth anniversary of the marriage of Mr. and Mrs. Davy, Odessa.

Plans for a new swing bridge over the Rideau at Smith's Falls have been prepared. It costs \$12,000.

It is the intention of J. Gravelle, Renfrew, to put a brick front on his hotel, and to connect it with the Stewart Block.

The Salvation Army have attacked Tamworth under the leadership of Captain Goodwin and Cadet Lida Baker.

Prince of Wales Lodge No. 146, A. F. and A. M., Newburgh, presented W. W. Bell with a handsome past master's jewel.

Norman Williams, Napanee, has sold his house and lot to John McCullough, for \$1,200. Mr. Williams has purchased a cottage from Godfrey Colp.

Bath has lost a number of people by death since the commencement of the year, viz: Mrs. Shorey, Mrs. Irons, Mrs. Kennedy, Wm. H. Davy, and Mary J. Laird.

Mr. Smith, of the Buckingham phosphate mines, secured a team from G. Cardiff, Admaston, for \$350; and a team from Mr. Elisha Francis at \$300. He also purchased a horse from Mr. Fitzmaurice.

Engene Richardson, Belleville, is engaged in frescoing the new hall of Napanee lodge No. 86, I. O. F. The lodge expects to occupy it about the first of June.

The electric fluid struck the Black Creek store-house, setting fire to it. The property belonged to Samuel Cardwell, Picton. The store-house was filled with pressed straw belonging to Haze Hicks, Greenbush.

An epidemic of measles, of a malignant type, accompanied by bronchitis, is raging at Campbellford and vicinity, and scores of families have been visited. In some cases the disease has terminated fatally.

Dr. Chamberlain, M. P. P., superintended the erection of a fine granite monument to the memory of his father, the late Dr. Chamberlain, who remains repose in the Farmersville baptist cemetery.

Geo. D. Smith, Deseronto, contractor, is very busy. He has been building the foundation of the Terra Cotta lumber company's works, and for four cottages. He has also received the contract for the mason work, plastering, &c., of St. Mark's church.

The dominion government has literally thrown away \$3,064.34 in Lennox and Addington in connection with the franchise and McCarthy acts. It cost nearly \$1,500 to have the names of reformers put on the list.

In Deseronto on Wednesday the marriage of Jennie Bradshaw to Samuel Emerson, of Belleville, occurred. The bride, attired in a travelling dress, was attended by Miss Hoover, Picton, J. C. Lazier, of Shannonville, acting as best man.

R. B. Conger, ex-M. P., was present in Picton, in 1837, when Sheriff Bullock headed a procession and read the proclamation which proclaimed Victoria Queen of Great Britain and the Colonies. Mr. Conger is in fair health and is anxious to take part in a jubilee procession on the 21st of June.

Anxiety was felt for the safety of Capt. Johnson Parkinson, South Marysburgh, last week. He undertook the contract of floating the schr. Parthenon, and taking her to Presquille. He got her off, and when she floated he ascertained her centre-board was fast. She floated around a day or two before he got everything in good working order, but finally succeeded in taking her to her destination.

Great interest is manifested by the members of the Society of Friends in the judgment pronounced by the supreme court in this celebrated Prince Edward case. The decision of the court of appeal for Ontario, reversing the judgment of Vice-Chancellor Proudfoot in favour of the defendants has been sustained. The party called the Progressives has thus succeeded, and will be entitled to all the property of the Quaker body in Ontario unless the decision of the supreme court is reversed by the privy council.
