COMMERCIAL MATTERS. CHEESE MARKET. BELLEVILLE, May 9.—At the meeting on Saturday about six hundred boxes of white cheese were offered. No sales. A few lots were bought through the week at 10 1/2, 11 1/2, and 11 3/4. At a corresponding date last year cheese was sold at 7 to 7 1/2.

MONTREAL, May 9.—The cable is still at 62s 6d, and the English market dull. New York has weakened considerably and the tendency is downward. Our local market is still of a jobbing character and dull at that. New cheese is in the market in small quantities, and meets with anything but an active demand; the value is doubtful, as we hear of sales at 12 1/2 and 13c, and also of enquiring from England at 11c; which means less than that allowing for commission. The market must go considerably lower before business becomes at all active or general, and a considerable reduction in the cable would be rather beneficial as it would lead to business. Finest old, 13 to 14c; new 11 to 13c; both nominal.

ADDRESS TO THE QUEEN.

The County Council Forwards a Valuable Memento—It is a Work of Art.

At the last meeting of the county council Messrs. Calvin, Hogan and Brown were appointed a committee to draft an appropriate address, to be forwarded to the queen. With the able assistance of Mr. F. Elkington, the county clerk, the work was performed. It was decided that the most dignified thing to do would be to have the address appropriately engrossed. And this work has been completed. To-day Mr. Elkington showed us the handsomely bound volume, prepared by Hart & Co., Toronto. The address is made into book form and is profuse in gold and morocco. In gold lettering across the cover are the words: "The Queen's most gracious majesty. Address from the council of the corporation of the county of Frontenac, Ontario."

The frontispiece is a work of art. It is done in water colors and bears the titles of her majesty, about which are appropriately grouped flowers and scroll work done in a dozen different colors. The address is illuminated upon bristol board, with tissue coverings. Three pages are employed in the engrossing of the address as follows: "To the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty: "May it please your majesty,—The council of the corporation of the county of Frontenac, in the province of Ontario, as the representative body of the county, most respectfully desire to approach your majesty with the assurance of the loyalty and attachment of your subjects, the residents of the county of Frontenac, to your throne and person; also to your majesty humble but sincere congratulations on the attainment of this your year of jubilee, as also the hope that you may be spared to us as our sovereign for many years to come."

On each page are appropriate designs with a cut of local buildings. The first is the court house, the second Queen's university, and the last the City hall. The work was all done with a pen, and shows wonderful ability on the part of the artist. It is the intention of the committee to enclose the address in a casket of native wood and forward it to the governor-general, who, as her majesty's executive officer, will see that it is laid at the foot of the throne. The city will have its address put into book form and forwarded in like manner.

The St. Lawrence hotel, Cape Vincent, bought by the Foxes, is refurbished and is open. It will be run winter and summer.

The attendance of pupils at the public schools last month was smaller than March. To sickness is attributed the decrease.

George Wallace, a well-known Montreal journalist, and for many years correspondent of the Toronto Mail, died on Monday, at the age of fifty-four years of paralysis.

General Greely, now the chief signal officer, has been awarded by the Paris geographical society a gold medal in recognition of his services in geographical science.

THE TELEPHONE BUSINESS.

The Profits of the Canadian Company Not Large—The Companies Different.

In reference to an item which appeared in several Canadian papers last week, calling attention to the receipts and expenses of "The Bell Telephone Company," (which naturally was taken by the Canadian public to refer to the telephone business here), the vice-president of the Bell telephone company of Canada writes to say that the company meant is the American Bell telephone company of Boston, and that the Bell telephone company of Canada is an entirely different concern, having no interest in the American company, but owing its own patents and operating its own exchanges and lines, and that the dividends of the Canadian company since its organization seven years ago, have not averaged over five per cent. per annum.

Even the business of the American company was not correctly stated in the item mentioned above, the expenses, according to its last annual statement, having been nearly a million dollars more than the amount stated.
