THE PITH OF THE NEWS.

The Spice of the Morning Papers and the Very Latest Telegrams. Another cabinet crisis is imminent in France. Mr. Gladstone wants the parnellites to be less obstructive.

The Irish college, Rome, has presented to the vatican a memoir on the Irish question. Perley & Pattee's lath mill, at Chaudiere Falls, was burned last night; loss \$25,000. Insured.

The vatican advises the Irish clergy to abstain from associating themselves with agitators. Nine thousand and sixty-three immigrants arrived on thirteen steamers at New York. Dr. Bristor was acquitted by the jury of the charges made against him by Ida Downs.

The English government refuses to take official part in the French exhibition, but it will do so unofficially. The breach in the personal relations of Mr. Gladstone with Lord Hartington and Mr. Chamberlain is now complete.

Sir Donald Smith gives \$25,000 to Trafalgar institute, Montreal, on condition that it is affiliated with McGill college. The Paterson iron works, N.Y., were totally destroyed by fire. Loss between \$250,000 and \$300,000; insurance \$75,000.

The late Samuel S. Tilden owned a large amount of property in England, and government lays claim to \$15,000 legacy duty as a condition of probating his will. The proprietors of the summer beer gardens and the German singing societies rejoiced greatly over the singing by Governor Hill of the New York beer music bill.

The Victoria University alumni on Tuesday night pronounced, by a vote of four to one, against the carrying out of the federation plan until the board is sure of \$450,000. Ten lots of the French jewels have been disposed of, realizing 505,200 francs. Among the articles sold was a diamond necklace for 181,250 francs and a pair of diamond epaulettes for 84,000 francs.

There was a slight shock of earthquake at Charleston, S.C., last night, and at Eureka, Rhonerville, and San Buena, California. The French minister of war has sent circulars to the prefects of departments, asking their advice as to the best methods of preserving and improving the breed of carrier pigeons.

The long pending suit of Mr. Jamieson, Belleville, against the Prince Albert colonization company was settled yesterday. Mr. Jamieson has been awarded his claim, about \$1,400, with costs. Thirteen hotel-keepers, of St. Thomas, charged with violation of the Scott act, after showing a disposition to fight the matter out, wisely decided to plead guilty and pay their fines, thus saving costs. The fines will amount to \$650.

Ministerialists expect that Mr. Balfour will withdraw from the Irish office immediately after the passage of the Crimes bill. He suffers from mental strain. Mr. Ritchie, president of the local government board, is willing to accept the post of Irish secretary. Prof. E. E. Barnard, of Nashville, announces the discovery of a new comet in the right ascension, 15 hours, 10 mins., 46 secs.; declination, south, 30 degrees, 36 minutes. It is very faint, and is moving slowly northeast. This discovery entitles Prof. Barnard to another Warner prize, making \$1,500 in all.
