ALL AROUND THE HOUSE.

Up Stairs, Down Stairs, in Kitchen and

in the Lady's Parlor. With such simple material as two peach baskets to begin with one may make something very useful and sufficiently decorative to be admitted to a "house beautiful." Place the bottoms of the two baskets together and fasten with a small screw and nut. This makes an hour glass shaped stand, very convenient for holding the weekly mending or sursery sewing. Paint it any pretty colorwhite and gold looks well-or it covered with white muslin and trimmed-with pockets and ribbons it will be dainty enough for a young lady's use or for a baby basket.

A Pretty Rug.

A gay, pretty rug, in imitation of the Turkish, may be made with bright pieces of wool carpet. Old salt bags, nicely cleaned, make a very good foundation on which to sew the strips of carpet. A nice size for a rug to spread before a lounge is a yard and a half long by three-fourths wide. For a smaller one a good proportion is one-yard long by one-half wide. Cut the pieces of carpet on the bias two inches wide and as long as the pieces of carpet will allow. Fringe each edge of the strips one-half inch. Put two of these strips together, one on top of the other, and sew them lengthwise of the foundation. Make other strips like this and sew them so closely together on the canvas that it will be entirely covered, and the fringed ends form a thick mat.

Knitted Silk Portieres.

Silk rags for portieres must be woven in a very particular manner, and it is not easy to get this kind of weaving done outside of a large city. Any one, however, can knit handsome portieres or curtains of silk. Cut the silk in strips about half an inch wide and sew together. If you have but little material that is bright and fresh in color, it will pay to dve some of the old stuff, in order that the curtains may not look too somber and faded. After the strips are wound into balls like carpet rags, get a pair of bone knitting needles about three-quarters of a yard long and as large as your finger, and then knit the plain

Hardwood Floors.

The beauty of hard wood or stained pine floors depends upon their being kept bright and free from dust; sweeping with a hair broom every morning and washing once a week will secure this. At a time when there is very much dust, a damp cloth must follow the broom. Never wash floor oil cloth without first sweeping it; for a muddy, half cleaned look will be the result.

An Ornamental Laundry Bag.

A pretty Turkish towel furnishes material for quite an ornamental laundry bag. Get one of the pretty blue and white or pink and white towels. Make this into a bag by joining the sides and running a casing around it about four inches from the top, through which run a narrow ribbon. Fasten pretty ribbon bows on each side and hang it from the dresser by a loop of ribbon.

Remedy for Red Ants.

A housekeeper says that red ants may be banished from pantry or store rooms by strewing the shelves with a small quantity of cloves, either whole or unground. The former are not so likely to get into food placed upon the shelves. The cloves should be renewed occasionally, as after a time they lose their strength and decay.

Fine Basket Plants.

One of the best of basket plants is oxalis floribunda. It is very easily grown and produces a profusion of bright flowers nearly all the year.

Convenient for Lunch or Tea.

Boned turkey or chicken keeps quite a long time and is therefore a very convenient dish to have in the house for lunch or tea. The simplest way to prepare it is to boil the fowl until the meat separates readily from the bones. Then remove the skin, chop and mix the light and dark meat; season with salt and pepper and any spices you may like to add. Boil down the liquid in which the chicken or turkey was boiled and pour over the meat. Shape it like a loaf of bread, wrap it up tight with a cloth and put under a heavy weight for several hours. Slice thin when serving.

A Tempting Delicacy.

Orange cream represents a new and tempting delicacy concocted with the juice of six oranges, one-fourth of a pound of white sugar, one pint of boiling water and six eggs. Beat the yolks, add sugar, orange juice and water, and stir over the fire until it thickens. When cool, put into glasses and on each one put the beaten whites sweetened and flavored with a little of the rind.

Potato Puffs.

Potato puffs are a favorite family dish. Take cold roast meat of any kind, chop it, season with salt and pepper; boil and mash potatoes and make them into a paste with an egg; roll it out and dust with flour and cut in rounds; put some meat on one-half of each fold over, pinch together and fry to a light brown.

An Attractive Hat Rack. The rustic hat rack here represented, if carefully made, will look well in the hall of




RUSTIC HAT RACK.

Make a solid base, either of heavy two inch plank or framed of two by three inch scantling. On this firmly nail a box and in the inside put one shelf. Procure a suitable section of a small tree and trim the branches so as to form hooks and pins for the bats and coats. In the top of the box cut a hole to fit the butt of the tree. The stick, to stand firmly, should go through the shelf also and be secured to the heavy wooden base. Bind around the top of the box some dark cloth and carry it up in folds to the base of the tree and tack it firmly to it. On the face of the box can be hung a door or curtain, thus forming a small closet. Pans should be set on each side of the box to catch drippings from umbrellas. Try to keep the bark of the tree uninjured, and the effect will be found very pleasing.-The World.


