A DARING TRAIN ROBBERY.

Going Through the Passengers and Relieving them of all Their Money.

Houston, Texas, June 18.-A daring train robbery was performed a short distance this side of Schulenburg on the Southern Pacific railway. As the train drew up at the station two men, with drawn revolvers, mounted the engine, covered the engineer and forced him to pull the train to the open prairie, a few hundred yards to the east, where a fire was burning, around which stood eight or ten men armed with Winchester rifles. The two robbers on the engine stood guard over the man at the throttle while the others went through the mail express and passenger cars. Nearly all the passengers were asleep and unaware of what was going on until they were aroused by the robbers. The first man tackled by them was W. Newburger, of New York, whom they struck on the head with a revolver, securing from him \$75 in cash, several diamonds, and a gold watch valued at \$100. Lou Mayer, of Cincinnati was relieved of \$35. R. L. Armsted, of New York, gave up 820. He had a larger amount with him, which was hid in the sleeping car. A gen-tleman from Mexico lost \$400. All the passengers were relieved of what valuables they possessed, and it is difficult to form an estimate of the amount of money and jewellery secured. The amount, however, is reckoned at \$5,000.
