CHURCH LAW.

The marriage question has at length been dealt with by the general assembly in a manner agreeable to the majority of Canadian Presbyterians.

Chap. 24, sec. 4, of the Confession of Faith shall be amended by striking out the last sentence thereof, contained in these words: "The man may not marry any of his wife's kindred nearer of blood than one may be of his own, nor the woman of her husband's kindred nearer of blood than of her own."

This the presbyteries will be certain to endorse, and when they have done so, and the matter has been dealt with finally, legislation upon the marriage question will be complete.
