ALL AROUND THE HOUSE. Up Stairs, Down Stairs, in Kitchen and

in the Lady's Parlor. A plain, straight backed, splint bottomed rocking chair may be made into a very pretty fancy chair. If old, the frame can be painted med, blue or any color preferred. Then make very thin flat cushions for the back and seat out of gray linen and tie them on with pretty bows of rather wide ribbon. Or, instead of linen, velveteen of some rich color, such as brown, dark blue, green, etc., and lined with ticking, may be used for the cushions.

Artistic Rag Carpets.

The passion for old time things has brought into fashion the home made rag carpets, but according to The Decorator and Furnisher, there are more artistic ways of having it woven than the everlasting stripe. A handsome carpet is a solid center piece of maroon. The warp should be colored the same shade as the rags, and all may be colored at home, if desirable, for economy's sake, with diamond dyes, and to utilize both light and dark rags a very handsome border is made of shaded red and orange woven in the old fashioned stripe. Another style is to have a very heavy warp used twice as thick as for ordinary carpet; color it several desired shades. This produces a very pretty checked carpet, weaving in the rags in stripes.

How to Cook an Old Fowl. Buyers of game or poultry who find themselves in possession of a mature bird instead of the young one they desired, may make a most acceptable dish of it, says The Restaurateur, by putting the fowl into a large vessel with a tight cover, and steaming it until it is thoroughly tender. It should be made ready for the dressing before the steaming process, and when done stuffed immediately, covered with the very thinnest possible slices of salt pork, and baked until brown in a very hot oven. The water in the steaming vessel must be saved for the gravy and for basting.

A Delightful Summer Dessert.

A delightful summer dessert is composed of one quart of milk, one-third of a box of gelatine, four tablespoonfuls of sugar, three eggs and vanilla flavoring. Put the gelatine in the milk and let stand for half an Lour. Beat the yolks with the sugar and stir into the milk. Set the kettle into hot water and stir until the mixture begins to thicken like soft custard. Have ready whites of eggs beaten to a stiff broth; the moment the kettle is taken from the fire stir them in quickly and turn into molds. Set away in a cold place to harden.

A Light Carriage Robe.

Billiard cloth makes a very suitable carriage robe for spring and summer use, and gray or any light color is pretty. Pink the edges all round and also pink a strip about two inches wide of a darker color, on the edge. Set the darker strip under the edge of the main piece, letting as much show as you like and stitch together. Embroider your monogram or any appropriate design in crewels in the center of the robe.

Effective Wall Coverings.

Chintz wall coverings are quite in favor, especially for bedrooms. To be pretty and effective for a bedroom, a chintz of very light ground, with small floral designs in soft blues, pinks or yellows would be good. Striped patterns should be avoided for this purpose. Darker patterns than those suggested can of course be found if a light room is not wanted.

Boiling Fish.

An experienced cook wraps his fish in a sheet of paper before boiling it. Square napkins of cheese cloth are better. A sheet of paper may be placed inside the napkin, which should be pinned in place. In this way the fish may be lifted out of the pot without danger of breaking apart, and be served without being mangled by the fork.

Aerated Bread.

Aerated bread is sometimes called the perfect bread. It is made without yeast or soda by forcing carbonic acid gas by machinery through the dough which has been mixed with water alone. This method is, of course, not practicable for a housekeeper. There is no fermentation and no loss of nutritive elements or of flavor.

A Favorite Dish.

French toast is a favorite dish with children and many grown people. It is made of thin slices cut from a stale loaf and moistened in milk and eggs, two eggs to a pint of milk, and then fried on a griddle with a mixture of butter and lard, or butter and beef drippings. It is eaten with sugar or syrup like griddle

Removing Grease Spots.

The following is an excellent way to remove grease from delicate fabrics: Cover the spots thickly with powdered French chalk. Lay a plece of blotting paper over this and place a warm but not hot iron upon it. Let the iron remain a little. If the grease is not entirely removed, repeat the operation.

Fir Tree Oil.

"Fir tree oil" is a new remedy that horticulturists are recommending for all the troubles incident to plants; a half pint of the oil to ten gallons of water is the proportion for soft wooded plants. It is accredited with removing verbena rusts and destroying rose slug, etc.

The Newest Floral Decoration. The newest floral decoration, according to Vick, who is authority in all matters pertaining to flowers, is the one shown in the ac-



FANCY FLOWER BASKET. It is made of straw, and is filled with flowers, according to the taste of the purchaser. Ribbons with the name of the florist in small gilt letters hidden in the loop of the bow decorate the little cart. It is a refreshing change from the more conventional baskets that are usually employed for the purpose.

Sundry Suggestions. Rub silver spoons with finely sifted wood ashes to remove stains left by medicine. Diluted hartshorn is good for taking mil-

dew from woolen goods. Salt and water cleans willow furniture. Milk bread dries out faster than water

To remove wet grass stains on white goods with water, rub in some soft soap and as much baking sods as will adhere; let stand half an hour, wash out in the usual manner, and the stain will generally be gone.






