COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

THE CHEESE MARKETS. GANANOQUE, July 18.—Nearly all the cheese boarded was sold at 9c. to Mr. Thomson.

LONDON, July 16.—Eleven factories offered 2,115 boxes, the first twelve days of July. A small lot of June sold at 8½c. The make in this section has fallen off from 15 to 30 per cent. on account of the continued dry weather.

OGDENSBURG, July 17.—Four thousand boxes were offered, and sales were 800 boxes at 9½, 1,200 at 9-10c, 600 at 9-10c, 500 at 9-10c, and 800 at 9½c.

CANTON, July 17.—Here 4,600 boxes were offered and sold at from 9c to 9½c. The markets were firm and fully half a cent higher. This cleans out all the June cheese in this section.

MONTREAL, July 18.—Market firm in tone, which indicates higher prices for next week. The cable advanced another 6d., from which it appears that some support is forthcoming.

PETERBORO, July 18.—The board here had a lively discussion over the conduct of some factories selling their cheese off the board. An agreement was drawn up, each one binding himself on a forfeit of \$25 or suspension from the board for the balance of the season to neither buy nor sell off the board.
