TEMPTATION OF JESUS.

EXPLANATORY NOTES BY REV. R. S. M'ARTHUR, D. D.

Lesson V of the International Series (Third Quarter), for Sunday, July 31. Text of the Lesson, Matt. iv, 1-11. Golden Text, Heb. ii, 18.

V. 1.—The temptation immediately followed the baptism. Led up of the spirit; that is, from the valley of the Jordan.

The Wilderness.—This was probably the wilderness of Judea or Jericho, which extended toward the Jordan. Travelers still speak of it as a dreary place.

V. 2 Fasted forty days.—Luke iv, 2 says "he did eat nothing." This shows that his fasting was as complete as that of Moses or Elijah.

V. 3. When the tempter came.—There is reason to believe that temptation in some form continued during the whole period of forty days.

V. 4. Christ's reply is sublime. It is written. He did not use divine power to annihilate the tempter.

V. 5. Then, etc.—Matthew's order is different from Luke's. He places this second temptation last.

V. 6. Cast thyself down, etc.—By his former device Satan sees that Jesus has faith in God.

V. 7. Again comes Christ's appeal to Scripture.—Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God.

Vs. 8, 9. The third temptation.—The second time Satan is foiled. No longer does he commence with "If thou be," etc.

Vs. 10, 11. Get thee hence.—Triumphant words! Let them ring through the world forever.

1. Since Christ was tempted, no man may expect to escape temptation.

2. To us, as to Christ, temptations will come in time of holiest enjoyment and loftiest spiritual enthusiasm.

3. Like Christ, we may overcome. The sword of the spirit is ours, too.

4. In the way of duty we may trust God with our hearts; but we must not dare meet Satan alone.
