RELATIVE TO PRIVATE BILLS.

CIXTY-TWO.-That all applications of Private or Local Bills, whether for the erection of a Bridge, the making of a Railroad, Turnpike Road, or Telegraph a Harbor, Canal, Lock Dam or Slide, or other like work-the granting of a right of Ferry; the construction of works for and plying ges or water; or for the incorpor-ation of any particular Profession or Trade, or of any Banking or other Commercial Company, or Cemetery Company; the incorporation of a Town or City; the levying of any local Assessment; the division lof any County of Township; the removal of the site of a County Town, or of Local Offices; the regulation of a Common; the re-survoy of any Township, Line or Concession; or for granting to any individual or individuals any exclusive rights or privileges whatsoever; or for doing any matter or thing which would affect the rights or property of other parties; or for making lany amendment of a like nature to any former Act,-shall require the tollowing notice to be published, VIX :

one newspaper published in the County, or Union of Counties, affected. In Lower Canada-A notice inserted in one newspaper in the English and one newspaper in the French language, in the District affected, or in both languages in there be but one paper; or if teere be no newspaper published therein, then, (in both (languages) in a paper published in an adjoining District, and also in the Official Ga-

Such notices shall be continued in each case for a period of at least two months du-I ring the interval of time between the close l of the next preceding Session, and the consideration of the Petition.
