RELATIVE TO PRIVATE BILLS.

CIXTY-TWO .- That all applications of Private or Local Bills, whether for the erection of a Bridge, the making of a Railroad, Turnpike Road, or Telegraph Line; the construction or improvement of a Harbor, Canal, Lock Dam or Slide, or other like work-the granting of a right of Ferry; the construction of works for sup plying ges or water; or for the incorporation of any particular Profession or Trade. or of any Banking or other Commercal Company, or Cemetery Company; the incorporation of a Town or City; the lovying of any local Assessment; the division of any County or Township; the removal. of the site of a County Town, or of Local Offices; the regulation of a Common; the re-survey of any Township, Line or Concession; or for granting to any individual or individuals any exclusive rights or privileges whatsoever; or for doing any matter or thing which would affect the rights or property of other parties; or for making any amendment of a like nature to any former Act, -shall require the following notice to be published, viz:

In Upper Canada -- A notice inserted in one newspaper published in the County, or

Union of Counties, affected. In Lower Canada-A notice inserted in one newspaper in the English and one newspaper in the French language, in the District affected, or in both languages it there be but one paper; or if teere be no newspaper published therein, then, (in both languages) in a paper published in an adjoining District, and also in the Official Ga-

Such notices shall be continued in each case for a period of at least two months during the interval of time between the close of the next preceding Session, and the coneideration of the Petition. Provided that if the application be of such a nature as not to affect any particular locality, the notice

may be published in the Official Gazette. SIXTY-THREE. - That before any petition for leave to bring in a Private bill for the erection of a Toll Bridge is presented to this Scott, Bart, with all his introductions, Incorporated under Act of Parliament. House, the person or persons purposing to petition for such Bill shall, upon giving the notice prescribed by the 62nd Rule, also, at the same time and in the same manner give a notice in writing, stating the rates which they intend to ask, the extent of the privilege, the height of the arches, the interval between the abutments or piers for the passage of rafts and vessels, and mentioning also whether they propose to erect a drawbridge or not, and the dimensions of such drawbridge.

Sixty-Foun. - That parties publishing notices of intended applications for Private Bills, under the 62nd Rule, shall be required to send, addressed to the "Private Bill Office, Legislative Assembly," (as soon as may be after its publication) a copy of the local newspaper containing the first insertion of any such notice (or a certificate of the insertion thereof, by the proprietor of such paper, and also, after the presentation of the Petition, a copy of the paper containing the last insertion of the said notice, or a certifi-
