Flour, &c .- There is a good export and home trade demand for common and medium grades of flour, and prices may be quoted 5 a 10c higher; sales 10,500 bbls at \$5,30 a 5,75 for common to good State; \$6 a 6,40 for extra do; early in the day (some inferior was sold as low as \$5,90, \$5,70 a \$6 for common to good superfine Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin and Ohio; \$6,20 a 6,75 for common to good extra do; \$4,90 a 5,30 for common to good Michigan.

Grain-For inferior Wheat the demand is less active, and prices have a drooping tendency while there is a pretty fair inquiry for good and rime parcels at about previous figures. The advance in freights checks the export demand. Sales 30,000 bushels at \$1,25 a \$1,27 for Chicago Spring and Racine; \$1,65 a \$1,81 for common to prime white Canadian; \$1,45 for mixed Winter and Spring Milwaukie; and \$1,65 for white Llinois.

For Rye there is a good export demand and prices still tend upward. It is reported that large parcels are wanted for Germany. Sales 8,500 bushels at 82c for Western, 83c for Pennsylvania and 85 a 86c for Northern, closing very buoyant at the outside quotation.

There is no important change in the Corn market and the demand is moderate; sales 30,000 busnels at 45 a 46c for distilling and 50 a 53c for common to good mixed Western (no shipping lots in marke:); 58 a 60c for Southern Yellow. Mixed and white Southern ranges from 56 a 66c. Oats are in moderate request at 36 a 37c for state, and 37 a 38c for Western. 
